

Please, don't take early retirement." (Christ Is Alive, 143).

When youth's life is founded on divine love and inspired by the Holy Spirit, they would be able to far greater things, ushering in a "new heaven and a new earth!"

The Karnataka Regional Youth Commission gladly present the report of one year which gives an exuberant series of events that happened in our Region which touched young people's hearts enthralling them to further work for the kingdom of God and the society. During the initial nationwide lockdown ICYM Karnataka Region had initiated the following virtual activities focusing on the mental and spiritual wellbeing of the youth of our region:

- TIKTOK Competition Since TikTok was trending among youngsters, we hosted a TikTok competition on any biblical / devotional aspect as the theme between O2 April 2020 and 11 April 2020. Among the several entries the best three were awarded.
- DREMUS "Let us Pray" In order to motivate the youngsters to nurture their spirituality, we conducted Oremus where the participant had to click a picture
 of their family during the family prayer; conducted between O7 April 2020 and I1 April 2020. Among several entries the best three were awarded.
- Make Your Own Rosary The month of May is dedicated to the devotion to Blessed Virgin Mary. We conducted a Rosary-making- competition with house hold items thereby portraying the importance of the Holy Rosary and the intercession of our Blessed Mother. We received several participants from across the State.
- Drawing Competition In view of the fifth anniversary of the publication of the Encyclical Laudatosi Pope Francis addressed and invited the Catholic community
 round the world to participate in Laudatosi Week from 16 24 May 2020. ICYM Karnataka celebrated this week by conducting a drawing competition keeping in
 mind the theme of the Encyclical.
- Called to Heal the Earth On the occasion of National Youth Sunday 2020 the ICYM Karnataka Region initiated a green chain movement where the youth of Karnataka was encouraged to plant a sapling and nominate others to do the same without breaking the chain.
- Oratio -Online Elocution Competition An online elocution competition was conducted between 15 August 2020 and 22 August 2020 on the theme 'The youth-vision to make India shine'. The aim of this initiative was to provide a platform for the youth to voice out their vision for our nation.
- Walk with Saints Walk with Saints is an initiative by the Karnataka Regional Youth Commission that introduces young saints and their lives weekly, thereby helping the youth to emulate their qualities and thus journey with them to become saints of our times. Through this initiative we have introduced about 61 saints. In conclusion to this initiative we intend to compile the stories of all these young saints into a book.









1. One day Programme to Mysore diocesan Youth

The Regional team organized one day Youth enhancement Programme for the youth of Mysore dioceses on 20th Feb 2021 at Catholic centre Bannimantap in Mysore. Around 150 youth gathered in Auditorium at 9.45 am for the programme. In the Keynote Address, Most Rev Dr K. A. William Bishop of Mysore Diocese called on the youth as 'power' and urged them to make use of the technology for the betterment not for destroying themselves.

Fr. Lourd Raj addressed the youth to become an inspiration to one another to draw them closer towards the church. Ms Jesvita gave them four keywords: opportunity, Inspiration, accompaniment, grateful which every young people should remember in their lives. Quoting the 'seven habits of highly effective teens, Rev. Fr Richard Menezes OCD called on the youth for a change in attitudes and character. Local resource persons Fr Jinto and Fr Manoj Manuel D'Souza the diocesan priests spoke on physical health and psychological health issues with the youth and called on the youth to attend to timely counselling if in need.

In the noon Rexco team took up the session with the youth and emphasized to them that building a team among the youth strengthens one another to achieve more goals. The youth of Mysore were exuberant in their participation in the day's get-together.



3. KRYC Council

The Karnataka Regional Youth Commission had organized KRYC Council on 11th March 2021 at CROSS, Bangalore. The Council meeting began with a short inaugural Ceremony at 10:00 am by watering the sapling and a short prayer service led by the youth of the Mysore Diocese. Fr. Lourd Raj welcomed everyone in the name of chairman Bishop and also expressed gratitude for all the support and cooperation from all movement to Karnataka Regional Youth Commission. Thereafter he asked the movement directors to present their activity reports.

2. ICYM Council at Mysore

The Karnataka Regional Youth Commission in collaboration with the diocese of Mysore had organized ICYM Council at Catholic Centre, Bannimantap Mysore on 21 February 2021. Bp. Henry D'Souza, the chairman of the Commission for Youth in his Keynote address exhorted the 52 youth leaders to be problem solvers. Recalling the recent Encyclical, "Fratelli Tutti" of Pope Francis Bp Henry called on the youth to love all as brothers and Sisters, with a dream in the mind, compassion in the eyes, joy on the face, truth in the mouth, love in the heart and service in the limbs and relationships in life. Rev Fr John Sequiera OCD, Director of Pushpashram Mysore, was the resource person of the day. He emphasized the youth to have a 'Christian vision of life'. He gave them various skills of life, smart thinking and building great attitudes and adorable relationships to develop the Christian vision of life and to become someone who can be trusted.

The agendas were discussed in the forum. The Regional Youth convention was one of the agendas that could be hosted by the Mandya Diocese with probable dates during Deepavali holidays 2021 with the theme Universal human solidarity and fraternity based on Fratelli Tutti.

After the lunch break, all the diocesan youth presidents reported the activities of the youth from January 2020 to February 2021 in their respective dioceses.



After having presented the reports the regional president Mr Jaison took up the agendas to discuss in the Council. The next Regional youth convention was one among those agendas. The directors and youth leaders took part in actively contributing their suggestions to various agendas discussed. Thus the meeting was concluded with lunch.

KRYC Holds Career Guidance Program To "Guide Tomorrow's Leaders Today."

An online Career Guidance Program for youth of Karnataka was held on June 19-20 by Karnataka Regional Youth Commission and Jesus Youth aimed at "Guiding Tomorrow's Leaders Today".

Bishop Henry D'Souza, the chairman of KRCBC Youth Commission in his inaugural address stated that "Youth of today are a great potential. Their dreams and energy are needed for the Church and society. All out efforts are needed to motivate youth to be leaders and achievers tomorrow."

Bishop D'Souza reminded that the Bishops of India had urged, "Much more needs to be done for them--- through intensive programmes to enter into the mainstream of public life --- to prepare the youth for leadership roles in civic and political life." (CBCI GBM 2014)

Speaking at the occasion, Jesus Youth Coordinator and academic Sunny Gudinho stated, "In these disruptive pandemic times which have sparked fear, frustration, and anxiety all around, youth need to be helped to learn and rethink our approaches, focusing all of our energy on defeating this pandemic and the challenges associated with it."

"Every student faces the question of 'what next after class 12th and 10th? They have to decide a stream out of - humanities, science and commerce and the only career guidance she/he has is the opinion of their parents and teacher's judgment based on marks and comments of their friends and neighbours. It is at this point that a career counsellor steps in and helps the child sail through these turbulent times". added Gudinho.

"Human capacities are infinite and can never be measured, nor can one judge what the other person can do. Every person has unique characteristics and has their own strengths and weaknesses. The key is to identify these unique qualities through career counselling," opined Justin, Jesus Youth Coordinator and academic.

The Jesus Youth have a large resource of persons who work in various professional streams of humanities, science and commerce including civil services. The career guidance program enlightened on many important topics related to career choices and guide all the participants towards a stable and right career choice.

Each of the sessions were of 2 -hour duration over online platform using Zoom Meeting & Youtube App.

The resource persons were David Olivera (Entrepreneur), Noel Abhishek (Business Analyst), Victor (Software Engineer), Sunny Gudinho (College Principal) and Justin (college Principal).

KRCBC Youth Commission secretary Fr Lourd Raj facilitated the program.

DIOCESAN REPORT

Bangalore Archdiocese honors 102 Youth COVID Warriors
YuvaChethana, the Youth Commission of the Archdiocese of
Bangalore on Sunday honoured 102 COVID volunteers at
PaalannaBhavana, Bangalore. His Grace Most Reverend Dr
Peter Machado, the Archbishop of Bangalore Archdiocese who
presided over the function, appreciated the projects of the
Youth Commission and expressed his gratitude to all the
institutions which facilitated COVID work during the second
wave especially the Camelian fathers, St John's hospital, St
Martha's and St Philomena's Hospital.

Addressing the COVID warriors, he said that volunteering during this time was like entering death's den. 'The compassion that you have shown to the patients in the hospital and to the poor and the needy will come back to you someday when someone will be compassionate to you', he added. Sharing his vision on the future plans of the youth commission, Fr Machado, said that food cabinets (community food banks) should be set up for the hungry in the archdiocese along with clothes banks.

Under the leadership of Mr Jerry Jokin the president of ICYM (Indian Catholic Youth Movement) Bangalore various youth groups of archdiocese swung into action during the second wave of the pandemic where 102 volunteered in COVID wards of hospitals helping 4,000 COVID patients, 28 youth volunteers in collaboration with "Here I am" group gave honourable burials to 256 dead, 20 youth cooked and served 300 meals daily reaching a total of 15000 meals to the homeless in Royapuram, Chamrajapet and Mysore road areas. There was also an initiative where 30 volunteers distributed 500 plus grocery kits to poor families and also conducted a 3-day vaccination drive where 300 people were vaccinated.







BANGALORE ARCHDIOCESE

The current initiative is providing 600 plus medical kits worth Rs 3,500 each to COVID patients with support from Don Bosco BREADS Bangalore.

Fr John Thekkekara, the Associate Director of St John's Hospital, SrGracyRGS - Superior, St Martha's Hospital, SrTheresiamma -Administrator, St Philomena's Hospital, Fr Cyril Victor - Director, PalanaBahvana, Sr Wilma Rebello, the Provincial of St Charles Borromeo Congregation, Mr. Praveen Peter - Congress MLC Candidate, Fr Rubin Mathew SDB - Director Don BoscoBREADSand other dignitaries were also present at the function.

Fr Anil D'Sa, the youth director, Bangalore Archdiocese, proposed the vote of thanks. COVID volunteers Melisha Noronha and Leo Anto shared their volunteering experiences working in the COVID warriors.





BELGUAM DIOCESE

The members of Youth Commission of Belgaum Diocese had an opportunity to help the poor and the needy during these days of distress and pain. The youth of different parishes along with their coordinators have responded voluntarily to the needs of people during this pandemic.

The Youth of St Joseph Parish took a special interest and initiative to serve the food kits to the poor families of the parish. A munificent donor Mr Brian D'Souza whose benevolent heart identified the needy families made it possible to share the same. In addition the Youth of Our Lady of Perpetual Succour Church, Dharwad had an opportunity to visit the poor families. Together they distributed the food grains to the needy families. The coordinator Fr Edward SJ and the Lady Animator SrNathalia were present.

The Youth Director of the Diocese, Fr Harry Victor celebrated the Holy Eucharist which was telecasted live on YouTube, for all the youth of the diocese on 13 June, 2021. Through the intercession of St Anthony of Padua the youth reaped the richness of God's grace spiritually. Fr Harry preached a beautiful homily on the Life of St Antony of Padua.

The Diocesan Youth Commission had frequent online meets to keep in touch with the youth. They were also kept informed and were encouraged to participate in the webinars and Bible quiz conducted by different associations. The Diocese Youth Commission also arranged an online memorial service to Fr Stan swamy SJ. Many youth, priests and religious prayerfully participated in the same.



















BELLARY DIOCESE

The youth in Bellary made a significant impression during the second wave of COVID-19 as it continued to evolve rapidly in Bellary. When the number of cases of COVID-19 surged during the second wave the youth fed the poor and needy on the highway road, hospitals and railway stations for 43 days with the help of youth director, senior youth members and some benefactors.

As the pandemic left many people jobless and their lives in hunger, the youth of Bellary diocese distributed food grains for the poor people of the diocese especially in the villages. With the help of Rt Rev. Dr Henry D'Souza, the Bishop of Bellary, the youth had distributed around 2000 kits to the poor families in the diocese.

Bellary was one of the most COVID-19 affected districts in Karnataka. To safe guard and protect the families from the deadly virus, the youth of Bellary distributed medical kits to the affected families with the help of CARITAS India.

World Environment Day is celebrated every year on 5 June to address the environmental issues. The youth of Bellary diocese celebrated this day by planting trees at the premises of St Anthony Cathedral Bellary and youth office. The youth director Rev. FrRemi Jose and president of Bellary Diocese Mr Arul Vincent, guided by Rev. Fr John Peter, the former youth director, along with the youth of Bellary deanery planted trees.

BELTHANGADY DIOCESE



The youth of Belthangady diocese did their part in helping the society in all ways possible during the testing times of the pandemic.

The SMYM Diocesan team of Belthangady under the guidance and mentorship of their director Rev. Fr Thomas Puthiyara and with AlenShaji, ex-secretary of ICYM, Karnataka Region hosted a wide variety of events under the banner of Challenge 2020 that ranged from Theme Song to Photography to Mono Act to name a few that helped the youth focus on their mental and spiritual well-being during the nationwide lockdown.

They conducted a webinar on 24 October 2020, on the topic 'Youth in the Society for God's Kingdom'. FrCijoChennadan CMI, was the guest speaker for the webinar.

One-Meal-Challenge was an initiative to help the needy affected by the COVID-19 pandemic where essential food kits were provided to Kodagu, Moornadu, Siddapura, Gonikoppa, Heggala parishes and Snehasadan, Mercy Home Houses for destitutes at Heggala from the 28 May 2021 - 14 June 2021. Also more than 50 youth along with 6 priests and the parish members of Gandibagilu parish cleaned the Seon Ashram, Gandibagilu on 17 June 2021.



CHIKKAMAGALUR DIDCESE

The ICYM youth of Chikkamagalur diocese have conducted several events for the youth over the year helping them grow and nurture themselves. One such event was the one day youth workshop at St Antony's church Hassan under the guidance of Fr Ronald Cardoza. 


They also conducted various awareness programmes on COVID-19 situation and the need for social distancing and safety precautions in the form of videos and poster.





WALK WITH SAINTS

Carlo Acutis was born on May 3, 1991, to Andrea Acutis and Antonia Salzano. Carlo was a very ordinary 21st century teenager who was cheerful, fun-loving and outgoing youth. He was known to stand up for bullied kids at school, loved the poor and went around the city giving money and food to the homeless.

This young man had an outstanding faith and love for God. He attended the Holy Mass daily, uninterrupted since the age of seven and called the Eucharist his highway to heaven. He believed that if people understood the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist and the amazing Grace that we received from it, their lives would be transformed.

Carlo frequented the Sacrament of Confession and Eucharistic adoration and recited the rosary daily. He deeply loved Dur Lady and remarked that Mary is the only woman in his life. Carlo's relationship with Jesus and Mary was at the very centre of his life and found great happiness in doing God's will. By his courage, enthusiasm and commitment to his faith, Carlo even managed to bring his friends and peers closer to God. He was fascinated by technology and by the time he was nine he became interested in computer programming. His mother bought him college level textbooks and he began to teach himself to programming. He eventually expanded his skills to video making and animation.


As a teenager Carlo was diagnosed with leukaemia. He said "I offer all the suffering I will have to suffer for the Lord, for the Pope, and the Church". He had asked his parents to take him on pilgrimages to the sites of all the known Eucharistic miracles in the world. He travelled to many of these sites and photographed them to create a virtual museum of miracles. He created a website presenting all the Eucharistic miracles of the world. He once said, the more Eucharist we receive, the more we become like Jesus, so that on this earth we will have a foretaste of heaven.


Carlo died on 12 October 2006. The funeral was packed with friends and all those who were touched by the life of Carlo. His sanctity in life was already around and people began to pray through his intercession; his mother received many accounts of people who were changed due to Carlos' witnesses of faith. 
